Intermittent Traffic Impacts Along And Near State Route 43 In Fresno And Kings Counties

Fresno and Kings Counties, Calif. – The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority), in cooperation with design-build contractor Dragados-Flatiron Joint Venture (DFJV), announces intermittent traffic impacts along State Route (SR) 43, in Fresno and Kings counties to transport pre-cast concrete girders to a high-speed rail construction site. Hauling will be intermittent between 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. starting Monday, Jan. 6, through Friday, Jan. 10, 2025.

This work is part of Construction Package 2-3 (CP 2-3), the 65-mile stretch of high-speed rail between East American Avenue in Fresno County and one-mile north of the Tulare-Kern County line.

Closure And Detour Information:

Intermittent traffic impacts along southbound SR 43, between Davis and Lansing avenues in Fresno and Kings counties to transport pre-cast concrete girders to a high-speed rail construction site.

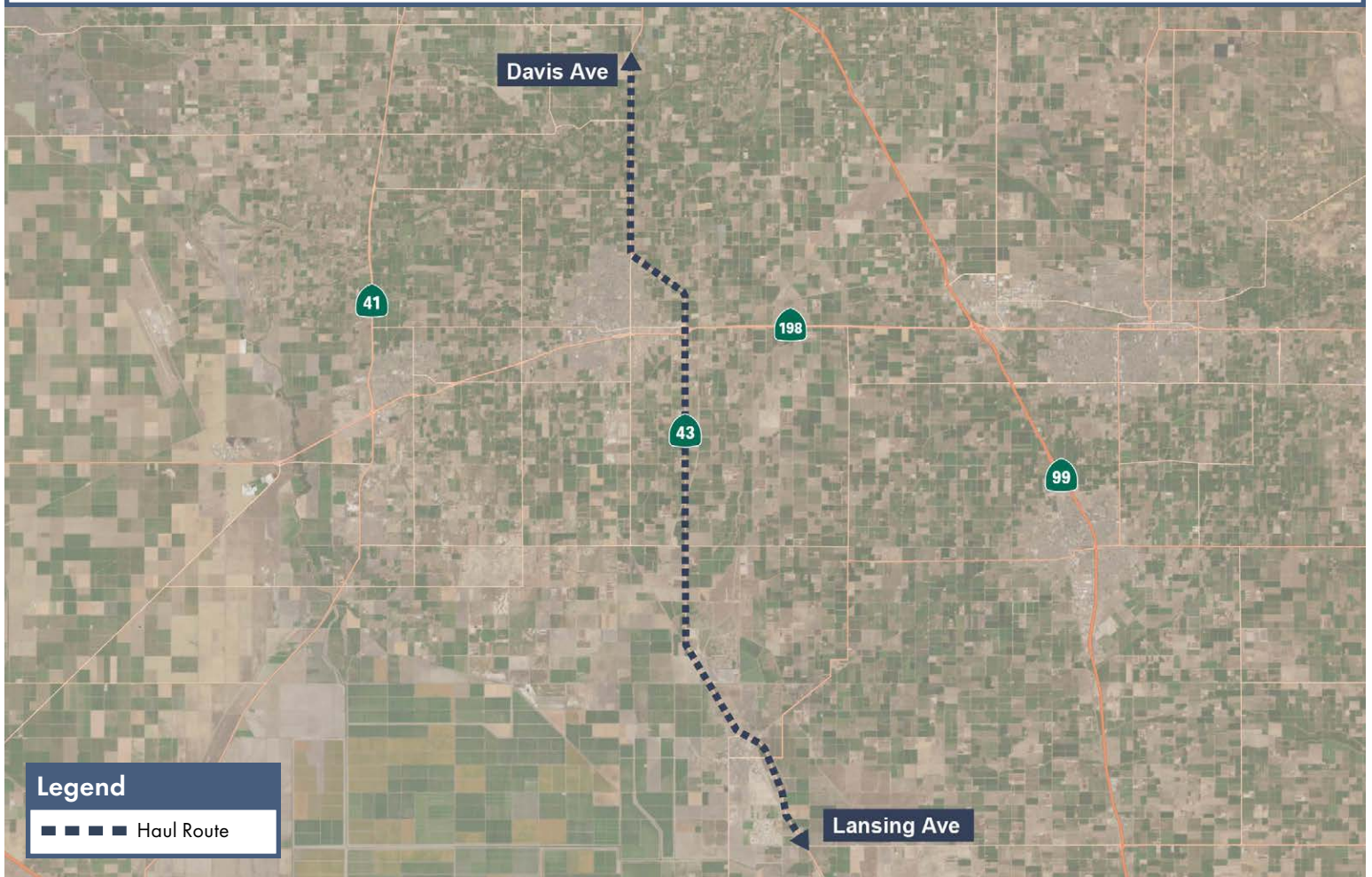
Hauling is scheduled intermittently between 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 6 through Friday, Jan. 10, 2025.

Haul Route

Girders will be transported south on SR 43 from a

private road south of Davis Avenue to a high-speed rail construction site south of Lansing Avenue.

Flaggers and pilot cars will be in place to direct traffic. California Highway Patrol will provide escort during transport.



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
